40 Audiological investigations

- A Masking for air conduction is necessary if the hearing loss of the test ear exceeds 50 dB.
- B A retrocochlear deafness gives a speech discrimination far better than expected from pure tone thresholds.
- C Carhart's test is a measure of tone decay.
- D Recruitment is uncommon in both cochlear and neural hearing losses but usual in conductive losses.
- E Loudness reversal elicited in the Fowler test indicates neural deafness.
