

Keratosis Pilaris

- A. Common condition, autosomal dominant, affects over 40 % of patients with atopic dermatitis and over 75 % with ichthyosis vulgaris
- B. Onset childhood, may improve with puberty (especially facial involvement)
- C. Discrete rough follicular keratotic papules with a rim of erythema
- D. Most commonly occurs on the lateral surface of upper arms, thighs, buttocks, and cheeks
- E. In children occurs on the lateral cheeks more commonly than the trunk and extensor surfaces of distal extremities
