

Multiple Gestation

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- 1. Exaggerated cardiovascular and pulmonary changes of pregnancy
- 2. Increased risk of uterine atony and postpartum hemorrhage due to greater uterine distention, necessitating large-bore IV access prior to delivery
- 3. Increased risk of aortocaval compression and hypotension
- 4. Greater O₂ consumption and decreased FRC compared to singleton pregnancies
