Tom ter Elst studied mathematics and physics at the University of Nijmegen (Masters for both in 1986) and received his PhD in mathematics at the Eindhoven University of Technology (1989). He held a postdoctoral fellowship at the Australian National University (1990–1992). From 1992 till 2006 he was a lecturer in Eindhoven. In the beginning of 2006 he took up a lectureship at the University of Auckland, where he was promoted successively to the rank of professor in 2016. His research interests include mathematical physics, evolution equations, functional analysis, and partial differential equations, particularly the area of elliptic operators.



Tobias Weth, born in 1974, studied mathematics and physics at the University of Mainz, where he also obtained his doctoral degree in mathematics in 2001. Afterwards, he held a postdoctoral position at the University of Gießen and spent one year as a research fellow at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. In 2007, he obtained his habilitation at the University of Gießen. Since 2008, he is professor and head of the research group of partial differential equations at the Goethe-University Frankfurt. His research is devoted to the geometric and qualitative study of nonlinear partial differential equations and related nonlocal problems. Tobias Weth is married and has three children.
