The following list is highly selective and those wishing to extend it should consult some of the more recently published works — for example, Aldcroft, Kindleberger, and Temin [1976] all of which have good bibliographical guides. In addition there are a number of invaluable volumes of statistics, especially *Historical Statistics of the United States, Colonial Times to 1970* (2 vols., Washington, DC, 1975); Federal Reserve Board, *Banking and Monetary Statistics 1914–1941* (Washington, DC; Reprinted 1976); and B. R. Mitchell, *European Historical Statistics, 1750–1970* (1975) which conveniently bring together all the data in their respective geographical areas. Most of the series compiled by the League of Nations' on population, labour, production, transport, trade and prices for the depression years can be located in the League of Nation, *Statistical Yearbook 1937–38* (Geneva, 1938) and *World Production and Prices 1937–38* (Geneva, 1938).
