ST. AUGUSTINE AND BEING

A Metaphysical Essay

One of the most profound and most influential interpretations of mediaeval thought in general, and of Thomistic ontology in particular, concerns the alleged contrast in basic metaphysical meaning between St. Augustine's concept of being, presented in the fifth century, and that of his thirteenth century co-religionist, Thomas Aquinas. According to this interpretation, the former notion retained such telling traces of Neoplatonism as to make it aptly describable as 'essentialistic' in opposition to the radically 'existentialistic' character of the Thomist idea of being.

A powerful effect of this line of thinking has been the widely accepted view that 'Thomism' marks a 'revolutionarily new development' at least in the history of Western metaphysics, with significant repercussions throughout the range of Christian thought.

The present monograph aims at assessing the tenability of this interpretation through a direct confrontation with a large number of typical texts found in the voluminous writings of the Bishop of Hippo.
