The “Data Economy Workshop: How Online Data Change Economy and Business” was organized by the International Hellenic University, the National Center for Scientific Research (Demokritos), the University of Thessaly, the Fraunhofer Institute for Applied Information Technology, and the RWTH Aachen University. It was supported by the H2020 Project YourDataStories, the Open Data Institute (Athens node), and the Open Technologies Alliance (GFOSS). Venue issues were arranged by the Centre for Research and Technology Hellas (CERTH) in Thessaloniki.
