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Trends in Colloid and Interface Science II

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Preface

During the meeting “New Trends in Colloid Science,” held in Como, Italy, in September 1987, the European Colloid and Interface Society (ECIS) was founded. The first decision of ECIS was to organize a yearly meeting of European scientists working in the field of colloids and interfaces. The first such meeting was held in Villa Olmo, Como, 2–4 September 1987. It was attended by about 130 participants from 17 European countries. About 100 papers were presented either orally or as posters. Roughly half of the full papers are collected in this volume; the other half appear as abstracts. The papers have been rather arbitrarily subdivided into three sections: Colloids, Amphiphile solutions, and Interfaces. It is a typical and interesting feature of this field that most contributions are on the borderline between physics and chemistry (and sometimes biology) and present, at the same time, a fundamental and a technological side. It will be one

task of ECIS to preserve the balance between all these different aspects in future conferences.

On behalf of ECIS, let me thank all the participants for their lively contributions, paper presentations, and discussions; the staff of Villa Olmo for the excellent organization of both the 1986 and the 1987 meetings; the members of the Scientific Committee, Lindman, Aveyard, Vrij, and Henglein for the preparation of the scientific program; my colleagues Laura Cantú and Mario Corti for their effective collaboration in the organization; and the generous meeting sponsors.

Let me finally remind readers that the Proceedings of the 1986 Conference have also appeared as a volume of this series (Vol. 73) which was edited by Prof. Hoffmann, the first Chairman of ECIS.
